
ized. The Talmudic study helps develop the analytical mind and way of thinking which is important for our students growth in more than just our Judaic classes", says Rabbi Moshe.

Rabbi's Corner

Elul - Field Report





of Mitzvot, Torah study and rectifying our misdeeds of the past twelve months.

Our sages in the writings of the Kabbalah explain that during this special month of Elul, a special light and spirit of mercy radiates from on high. It is called the Divine Light of the 13 Attributes of Mercy. As such, it is an opportune time to take advantage of this spiritual energy.

Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi (1745-1812) explains this special spiritual energy with a parable in his classic work Likutei Torah. He explains that the month of Elul is comparable to the King being in the field. During the year, the king lives in his palace which is heavily guarded and protected. If one wishes to visit the king, he must be granted an audience, many months in advance and come visit the king as he sits on his throne in his majestic throne room. However, from time to time, the king goes out into the field to visit his subjects. He interacts with the common folk and listens to their requests and needs. When the king is in the field anyone can approach the king just the way he/she is.

So too, in the month of Elul, Hashem is "in the field" giving us the special opportunity to come meet Him and reconnect with Him. Thus, it is a time of Divine Mercy and great spiritual energy.
